FROM THE RABBI'S STUDY

Where Prayer Lives

This is the translation of Mishkan T'filah, the name of our new prayerbook. For the first time in four decades, we have a new prayerbook.

To give you a sampling, this prayerbook has much more surrounding each prayer. Each is a different option for reading. People can be praying on the same page, yet have words which resonate with them uniquely.

For instance, pages 206 and 207 have Hebrew for "Eleh Devarim." The Hebrew is transliterated in English letters right next to it. Below it is a modern, yet literal translation:

THESE ARE THINGS
that are limitless,
of which a person enjoys the fruit of
the world,
while the principal remains in the
world to come.
They are: honoring one's father and
mother,
engaging in deeds of compassion,
arriving early for study, morning and
evening,
dealing graciously with guests, visiting
the sick,
providing for the wedding couple,
accompanying the dead for burial,
being devoted in prayer,
and making peace among people.
But the study of Torah encompasses
them all.

On the opposing page, there are interpretations and applications of this prayer, for example:

WE NEED Jewish men and women to become a Jewishly inspired and informed leadership — not only rabbinical but also lay. We need Jews more conversant with the thought and teachings of Judaism, to whom Judaism is no cold remote theology and Hebrew learning a matter of mystical ignorance, and to whom Jewish culture is no proxied culture. We need a reassertion of faith and a reawakening of interest in a cultural heritage that is all too rapidly being relegated to the exclusive possession of graduates of rabbinical seminaries. . . . We desperately need such lay leaders today with vision and fortitude.

On the bottom of the page is an explanation of the Hebrew and how it has affected Jewish life:

k'neged kulam . . . encompasses them all . . .

Implies equality in some sense, but the Hebrew does not say clearly what sense it is. Is studying Torah like each mitzvah, taken separately, for example, or like the entire group of mitzvot mentioned here, taken all together?

FROM THE EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT

As I come to the end of my term as Executive Vice President here at Temple Beth Hillel, I am astonished at how quickly the last year has gone by. I'm also amazed that I find myself in the position of being nominated as our community's next President. I'm deeply humbled to be considered for such an extraordinary honor. When I was told that I was nominated, I spent some time thinking about the kind of mark that I would hope to leave on our community as President. I settled on the following three focus elements.

Sh'ma: Every community faces its challenges, and ours is no different. Over the last several years at different times, we have struggled with contention, disagreement, and strife. I believe that many of our challenges have been as a result of not really listening to each other. Many of our leaders, myself included, have found it difficult to listen to each other and to our community as a whole. As a result, where there could have been unity, there has been contention. I commit to our community now, whether as President or congregant, I will *sh'ma*...I will listen to all of my fellow congregants with an equally open mind and heart. I may not agree, or take an action that someone requests, but I will listen. Rabbi Glickman often says "The Sh'ma appears before the V'ahavta in our prayer service because you must listen before you can love." How can we love our fellow congregants if we don't listen to them? How can I, as a leader, expect others to listen if I do not?

Vision: I believe that we need to develop a vision for ourselves. I want to work with a number of our community members to build a team for listening to our congregation, in small groups and individually. Together with the community, I hope to determine what we feel are our highest priorities and values. The result of this work will be a vision statement that represents those ideals and principles in a tangible way. This vision will inform everything we do and every decision we make. I plan to utilize resources, people, and information from the URJ to help construct the team. They can also teach us the best way to gather this information, present it, and work with our community to bring it all together in a form that we can agree on.


Finances: We are a community. Rabbi frequently reminds us that we are a holy community. He is absolutely right. We also have bills to pay, budgets to manage, a building to maintain, and a myriad of other financial obligations. Having taken part in the budget process a couple of times, most recently in this last cycle, I believe that we need to take a more holistic approach to our finances. I'm not certain what the new process will look like, but I can say that it will involve having a "finance" committee formed in the first part of the fiscal year. This committee will become the budget committee later on, but will have had an entire year to discuss our entire financial structure. Those discussions will include items like dues (in terms of amounts and structure), alternative revenue streams (whether fundraisers, facilities rentals, or other ideas), debt reduction, and cost-saving initiatives. Some suggestions have already been made and may be implemented soon. Over the course of the year, I plan to work with this committee and finance experts from the URJ to bring a proposal for discussion to our congregation. From that proposal, I intend to work with our whole community to improve our financial circumstances and ensure the financial security of our synagogue for generations to come.

Thank you for the opportunity to serve you thus far and thank you also for considering me for the position as our next President. If you elect me to serve as our congregation's leader, these are the three elements that I plan to focus on. In the months to come, you can look forward to articles describing each of these elements in more detail and providing updates on the status of each area. ISRAEL THROUGH THE H'S

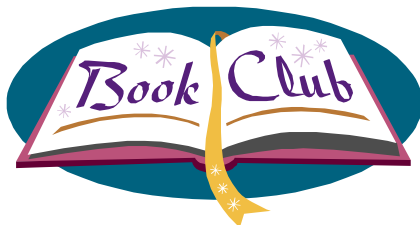

TORAH PORTIONS


Beha'alotcha - Numbers 8:1-12:15 —This portion is jam-packed, telling the story of the consecration of the Levites, the first Passover in the wilderness, the silver trumpets, the cloud of glory, the departure from Sinai, the grumbling in the wilderness, the first Sanhedrin and the punishment of Miriam.

Shelach - Numbers 13:1-15:41 —The Torah reading tells the tragic story of how the spies returned with a bad report about the Land of Promise and influenced the congregation of Israel to rebel against G-d. Thus G-d consigned the generation of Moses to wander in the wilderness for forty years.

Korach - Numbers 16:1-18:32 —This week's Torah reading tells the story of how Korah led an unsuccessful rebellion against Moses and Aaron. After thwarting the insurrection, God confirms Aaron in the priesthood and provides additional legislation regarding priestly and Levitical privileges and responsibilities.

Chukat - Numbers 19:1-22:1 —Chukat presents the mysterious laws of the red-heifer ceremony for purification after contact with human death. This reading also contains the story of Moses striking the rock, the stories of the deaths of Aaron and Miriam, and the wars with the Amorites. The portion concludes with the host of Israel encamping on the edge of the Promised Land.

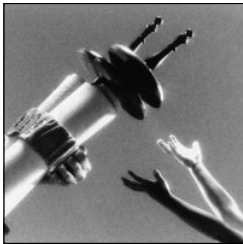
