

I should listen to congregations who've made similar changes in their synagogue's financial structure. Just as with the process of forming a vision, I'll need to listen to the members of our community. As we consider alternative ways to generate income and prioritize our expenses, I'll need to hear and understand the concerns, questions, and fears of our members so that I may address them and help establish the best way for us to move forward.

While listening is important as it relates to the other focus elements I've outlined, it has a much broader reach than that. As president, it is my obligation, more than anyone else aside from our clergy, to listen to any member who has something to say about our community. I must be prepared to listen to members' concerns and to the advice of fellow lay leaders, experts, and clergy. Listening by itself, however, is not always sufficient. Listening is simply one side of a coin, the other side is action.

While sometimes we simply need to be heard, there are situations that require action. It can be a challenge to determine when to listen and when to act. I will try to meet that challenge and act when it is required. I can't promise that I will act in the way that a particular congregant might prefer, but I can say that when I must, I will act. 

TORAH PORTIONS


Balak - Numbers 22:2-25:9 —This week's Torah reading tells the story of how Balak hires the occult prophet Balaam to lay a curse on Israel. Balaam meets resistance from God, has a conversation with his donkey and ends up blessing Israel instead of cursing them.

Pinchas - Numbers 25:10-30:1 —In this Torah portion, G-d makes a covenant of peace with Phinehas and his descendants, orders a second census, settles questions about inheritance, appoints Joshua to succeed Moses, and lists the sacrifices for the appointed times.

Mattot - Numbers 30:2-32:42 — Numbers 30 discusses the laws of vows and oaths. Numbers 31 tells the story of Israel's war with Midian. Numbers 32 relates the story of how the Reubenites, the Gadites and the half-tribe of Mannaseh came to inherit the land east of the Jordan River. Except in biblical calendar leap years, Mattot is read together with the subsequent Torah portion, Massei, on the same Sabbath.

Massei - Numbers 33:1-36:13 — Massei is the end of the continuous narrative of Torah that began in Genesis with the creation of the universe. The narrative does not resume until the end of Deuteronomy, when Moses dies.

The final reading in Numbers settles several last-minute details. In it we find a list of the encampments from Egypt to the plains of Moab. We also find instructions for apportioning the land, as well as the specifics regarding the borders of the land. While explaining the land and its borders, Moses introduces the laws of the cities of refuge and more inheritance laws.
