


SISTERHOOD LEADERS

TORAH PORTIONS

Acharei Mot- Leviticus 16:1-18:30 — Leviticus 16 describes the Tabernacle ceremony for the holy festival of the Day of Atonement. Leviticus 17 establishes general rules for sacrifice and sanctuary. Leviticus 18 lays down specific laws about permitted and forbidden sexual relationships.

K'doshim - Leviticus 19:1-20:27 — Leviticus 19 describes the holy community through a series of specific commandments. Leviticus 20 warns against the snares of sexual immorality and idolatry, mandating a death penalty for certain sins.

Emor — Leviticus 21:1-24:23 — Emor begins with special laws of sanctity, propriety and purity for the priesthood. Leviticus 23 provides an overview of the biblical calendar, a listing of G-d's appointed times.

B'har — Leviticus 25:1-26:2 — This portion from the Torah introduces the laws of the sabbatical years, the jubilee and laws concerning redemption.


Norway and the Holocaust

Author Irene Levin Berman will talk about her latest book, Norway Wasn't Too Small: A Fact-Based Novel about Darkness and Survival. Irene Berman was born just before the Nazi invasion of Norway in 1940. She was one of 1,200 Norwegian Jews who avoided annihilation by escaping to neutral Sweden. Close to 800 of the remaining Jews were deported to Auschwitz, including 7 members of her father's immediate family. She has also written *"We Are Going to Pick Potatoes": Norway and the Holocaust, the Untold Story*, a remembrance of growing up Jewish in Norway. Irene has spoken nationally and internationally, sharing her experiences and the little-known story of the Norwegian Jews.


