Spring to branch out to the vibrancy of new life and the potential it promises.

Summer to fulfill that potential and rejoice.

Autumn to gather in and appreciate.


Winter to draw close, reflect and envision.

We might have a favorite season, but the greatest meaning and deepest happiness comes in living the full cycle. Sometimes, we can get stuck in a single part of a cy-

cle. We might like it the best, we might be good at it or we might have fallen into it. Even if you most enjoy springtime, if you stay there, you are caught up in potentials and promises, and you don't have the rewards of fruition. You also bounce from ephemeral to flighty without the grounded nature of insight and direction.

TORAH PORTIONS

Nasso — Numbers 4:21-7:89 — This Torah portion finishes up the census of the Levites that was under way at the end of the last Torah portion, before going on to discuss the purification of the camp, the ritual for a woman suspected of adultery, the laws of the Nazirite vow, the priestly benediction and the gifts the heads of the twelve tribes brought for the dedication of the altar. sins.


Beha'alotcha —**Numbers 8:1-12:15** — This portion is jam-packed, telling the story of the consecration of the Levites, the first Passover in the wilderness, the silver trumpets, the cloud of glory, the departure from Sinai, the grumbling in the wilderness, the first Sanhedrin and the punishment of Miriam.

Shelach — Numbers 13:1-15:41 — The Torah reading tells the tragic story of how the spies returned with a bad report about the Land of Promise and influenced the congregation of Israel to rebel against the LORD. Thus God consigned the generation of Moses to wander in the wilderness for forty years.

Korach — **Numbers 16:1-18:32** — This week's Torah reading tells the story of how Korah led an unsuccessful rebellion against Moses and Aaron. After thwarting the insurrection, God confirms Aaron in the priesthood and provides additional legislation regarding priestly and Levitical privileges and responsibilities.




Tuesday evening, June 13th at 7:00 p.m. -
