TORAH PORTIONS

Va'etchanan —**Deuteronomy 3:23-7:11**— The portion completes the historical prologue of the Deuteronomy covenant document and begins a rehearsal of the stipulations. Part of that rehearsal is a repetition of the Ten Commandments and the famous first passage of the Shema: Deuteronomy 6:4–9.

Ekev — **Deuteronomy** 7:12-11:25— This portion of Deuteronomy speaks of the rewards that will come to Israel on the heels of keeping God's covenant and commandments.

Re'eh— **Deuteronomy 11:26-16:17**— You shall not hesitate to give, nor murmur when you do give; because you shall know who is the good repayer of the hire. You shall not turn away from him that is in want, but you shall share all things with your brother, and shall not say that they are your own; for if you are partakers in that which is immortal, how much more in things which are mortal? (Didache 4:7-8)

Shoftim — **Deuteronomy 16:18-21:9**— The Torah of King Messiah is written not with ink, but with the Spirit of the living God, not on tablets of stone, but on tablets of human hearts (2 Corinthians 3:3).

The evening will begin with a dairy supper at 6:00 p.m. An interesting study session will begin at 6:45 followed by Havdalah and our traditional Selichot service as we, in silence, prepare our sanctuary for the High Holidays, changing the regular prayer books to the Machzorim and dressing the Bima and Torahs in white.

On August 4, at 7:00 pm Rose Vigdal from Habitat for Humanity will speak at Temple Beth Hillel during services. With her prior seven years of experience at Hartford Habitat she understands the Habitat for Humanity mission and shares in the vision of "A world where everyone has a decent place to live." Working on builds in the Greater Hartford area, Rose has experienced the strengthening of communities by empowering families to change not only their lives, but also the lives of future generations through homeownership and home preservation opportunities.

In 2015 she expanded her knowledge and went on a Habitat Global Village trip. A team of 13 went to build with Habitat Guatemala's Chimaltenango affiliate (Habitat's oldest and largest International affiliate) for their Casa Mil75 project. This project incorporated over 1,100 people involved nationally, including 700 national volunteers on 181 local committees. The goal was to build the 75,000th home which they did. When asked about Habitat's mission, Rose responded, "Everyone should have a place to call home, Habitat provides that opportunity to those who are willing to work and make it happen."

During the months of November through April, Hartford Habitat would love to host your individual teams, families, faith and civic groups. They will be building in East Hartford, New Britain and Hartford.

It's a full day of building and learning with your team on a Habitat site. Volunteers are the heart and soul of Habitats mission. You will join the ranks of over 4,000 volunteers who contribute over 30,000 hours each year to support Hartford Area Habitat for Humanity.






Book Talk with Elizabeth Poliner


