TORAH PORTIONS

Vayakhel— Exodus 35:1-38:20 - This portion from the Torah describes how the assembly of Israel worked together to build the Tabernacle. In most years, synagogues read Vayakhel together with the following portion, Pekudei.

Pekudei— Exodus 38:21-40:38-The last reading from Exodus begins with an audit of how the contributions for the Tabernacle were used. The portion goes on to describe the completion of the Tabernacle and its assembly and concludes by depicting the glory of the LORD entering it. In most years, synagogues read Pekudei together with the previous portion, Vayakhel; therefore, the comments on this week's reading will be brief.

Vayikra— Leviticus 1:1-5:26 This portion introduces the sacrificial service and describes five different types of sacrifices.

Tzav— Leviticus 6:18:36- The last chapter of the reading describes the seven-day ordination of Aaron and his sons as they prepared to enter the holy priesthood.

Shemini— Leviticus 9:1--11:47 Shemini is the twenty-sixth reading from the Torah and third reading from the book of Leviticus. The word shemini (שמיני) means "eighth," and it comes from the first words of Exodus 9:1, which says, "Now it came about on the eighth day that Moses called Aaron and his sons and the elders of Israel" (Leviticus 9:1). The text goes on to describe the events of the eight day after setting up the Tabernacle, a phenomenal worship service followed by a tragic incident. The reading concludes with the biblical dietary laws regarding animals fit for consumption and prohibitions regarding those that are unfit.

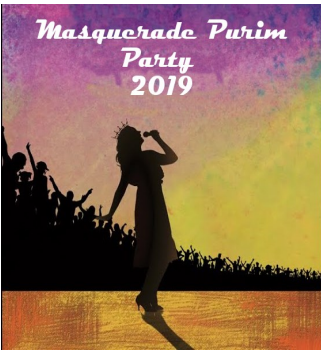
BOOK CLUB

School Faith Volunteer Award

for our work with the Kitchen to Pantry Initiative with Hands On
Hartford!

Twenty-one volunteers completed 263.5 total hours processing produce for the Manna food pantry. Our members sorted, cleaned, cut and packaged more than 5,000 pounds of produce that would otherwise have been thrown out. Our donations included 80+ pounds of spices, packaged into smaller bags, along with salt, pepper and 245 bags of tea. Another contribution was sharpening the kitchen's knives several times. We have all enjoyed this year so much doing good work for the 600 families Manna serves. We are honored and proud to receive this award.

Social Action Squad's Year in Review

The Social Action Squad held its first Volunteer Appreciation Party on February 24th. More than 30 individuals volunteered throughout 2018 in 18 different events. It all begins with the Shema Tour. The tour for 2018 was quite special, as it was led by Pastor Karen Bailey-Francois.

We toured Hartford, stopped at Hands On Hartford, lunched at Lena's just before its surprise closing, stopped in at Hartford Seminary and Young Israel. We began working with Hands on Hartford that February. Over all 21 individual volunteers contributed 263.5 hours! More impressive 5,149 pounds of produce was "rescued" and given to those in need. At the SAS's Appreciation party, The Moldy

Pineapple awards were announced. Leland Bradbard took the Gold for the most hours, Paula Bradbard took the Silver and Phyllis Green took the Bronze. In the superlative's category, our dear Babs Klein took the Miss Congeniality, while her husband received the "most-likely-to-set-up-the-tables" award. Carol Bettigole, a very dedicated and faithful volunteer who has come to almost all events won the Golden Dinst award. In addition to the commitment to K2P our Brit Olam Society research and finalized a Brit for the congregation to be included among the more than 200 URJ congregations making a commitment to making the world a better place. We become involved in the Federations efforts

to help displaced citizens from Puerto Rico by participation in a toiletries drive. This turned into several sorting parties and shelf stocking Sundays at the Center. I am proud to say TBH had the most volunteers, but also the most overall hours dedicated to this endeavor. More than \$1800 was donated to Foodshare during our High Holiday drive and the truck of my Toyota Corolla was filled many, many times This year we were invited to help sort Yom Kipper kosher food donations, showing up in force to help Jewish Family Services. Our crew planted vegetable plants to give away at the congregational meeting and at the Israel@ 70 festival to bring awareness to the health needs of the hungry. We

had loads of fun at the festival handing out plants and helping kids get their own seedlings started. We held a few Divide and Conquer Spice Nights and Marion Berman ran 4 blood drives. We held a community briefing on the plight of the Rohingya and made a late-night call to hear from Rabbi and Mindy while on their trip. Sadly, Social Action helped organize the URJ's Solidarity Shabbat following the massacre in Pittsburg. The One Book reading of Working Poor; Invisible in America was a great success as we partnered with local business woman Cindi of the Bookclub Book Store on Sullivan Ave. So many thanks to all our volunteers. What an amazing year.

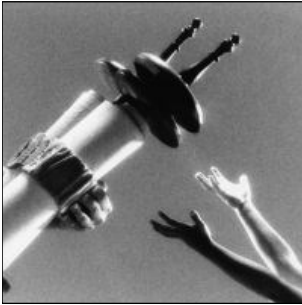
