## FROM THE PRESIDENT

Hello Temple Beth Hillel Families,

## TORAH PORTIONS

**Chayei Sarah — Genesis - 23:31—25:18** The word Noah is related to the Hebrew word for "rest." Genesis 5:29 says that his parents named him Noah (Noach נח) because they hoped their son would give them rest (nacham, נחם) from their toil. The contents of section Noah tell the story of Noah's flood, the tower of Babel and the beginning of the Abrahamic line.

**Toldot— Genesis 25:19-2-8:9** Toldot tells us the story of the birth of Jacob and Esau and their struggle for the birthright and blessing of their father, Isaac. We also learn about Isaac's trials and difficulties in the land of Canaan. The portion concludes with Jacob's deception of Isaac in order to procure the family blessing.

**Vayetze—Genesis 28:10—32:2** This portion tells the story of Jacob's flight from his brother Esau, his vision at Bethel, his employment with his uncle Laban and his marriage to the two sisters, Rachel and Leah. Jacob's double marriage results in a baby-bearing contest that gives him eleven sons. At the end of the portion, Jacob leaves Laban and returns to the land of Canaan, but not before Laban tries to stop him.

**Vayishlach — Genesis 32:3—36:43** The portion follows Jacob's adventures in the land of Canaan, including the loss of his beloved wife, Rachel.

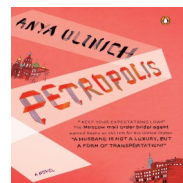

**Professor Emeritus, Mount Holyoke College**

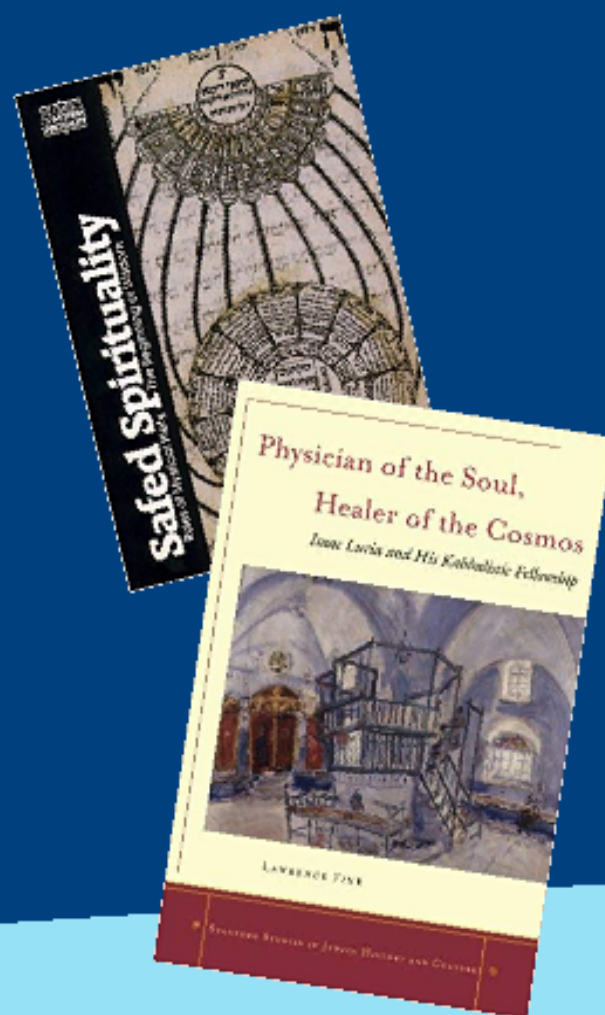
