TORAH PORTIONS

Tazria—Leviticus 12:1-13:59 The name of the twenty-seventh reading from the Torah is Tazria (תזריע), which means "she conceived." The name is derived from the words of Leviticus 12:2, where the LORD says to Moses, "When a woman [conceives] and bears a male child." Leviticus 12 discusses the laws of purification after childbirth. Leviticus 13 introduces the laws for diagnosing and quarantining lepers.

M'tzora—Leviticus 14:1-15:33—Leviticus 14 spells out the complex purification rituals for the cleansing of a leper and a leprous home. Leviticus 15 briefly covers the laws regarding ritual unfitness stemming from bodily emissions. Except in biblical calendar leap years, Metzora is read together with the previous Torah portion, Tazria, on the same Sabbath.

Pesach—Exodus 12:21-51—The reading tells the adventures of the Israelites as they leave Egypt, cross the Red Sea, receive miraculous provision in the wilderness and face their first battle.

Shemini Shel Pesach—Deuteronomy 14:22-16:17 As the observance of Passover draws to an end, the Torah portion includes the dramatic recounting of the splitting of the sea in this poem known as "The Song at the Sea." Written with great emotion, this poem attempts to convey the power of "God's might hand." So powerful is the imagery that verses of this poem have become part of the Jewish liturgy. The poem comes to a climatic finish with Miriam, the prophetess, picking up her timbrel and leading the women in dance.

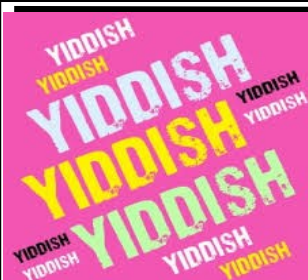

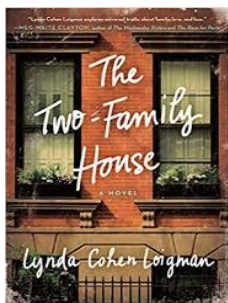

TRIO SEFARDI



U.S. premiere of “La Nona Kanta: The Remarkable Life of Flory Jagoda”
Saturday evening, May 4 at 8 p.m. at Temple Beth Hillel

Presented by Temple Beth Hillel's Congregation Beth Ahm Legacy Fund, in collaboration with the National Institute for Holocaust Documentation at the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum in Washington, D.C.

Live concert and multi-media presentation, celebrating the life and work of Flory Altarac Jagoda, the National Heritage Award-winning, Bosnian-born Sephardic singer and composer who is known worldwide as the *Keeper of the Flame* of Sephardic and Ladino music. “*La Nona Kanta: (translation: The Grandmother Sings) The Remarkable Life of Flory Jagoda*” **is performed by Trio Sefardi**, a Northern Virginia-based ensemble of musicians who each played with Flory, now age 95, for many years.

In filmed interviews, Flory Jagoda shares her life's experiences and tells how music helped her escape from Nazi-occupied Yugoslavia when she was a teenager; how she made a life in the U.S. and turned the tragic fate of her family and Balkan Sephardic culture into a celebration of five centuries of faith and tradition, giving meaning to the rest of her life, and delighting audiences worldwide. Her recorded narration alternates with live performances of her Ladino music by Trio Sefardi, and features photos from the Altarac Family archives and video from the film documentary “*Flory's Flame*”.

“Music is universal,” explains Cantor Scott M. Harris. “Jews too have developed their own musical traditions and we have carried these melodies to the many lands we have settled and have taken them with us from the many lands we have been forced from. Thank you to Trio Sefardi for perpetuating for future generations the music of the Sephardim. We invite people of all faiths to come join us at this wonderful event.”

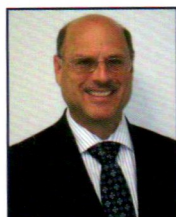

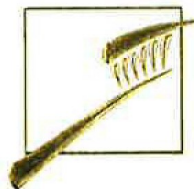

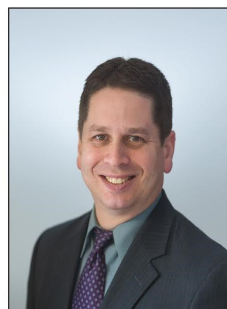
