TORAH PORTIONS

Beshlach—Exodus 13:7-17:16 The reading tells the adventures of the Israelites as they leave Egypt, cross the Red Sea, receive miraculous provision in the wilderness and face their first battle.

Joshua Maciel

Yitro—Exodus 18:1-20:23. The portion tells the story of Jethro's visit to the camp of Israel, then relates the great theophany at Mount Sinai, where God gives Israel the Ten Commandments and invites the people to enter a special covenant relationship with Him.

Mishpatim— Exodus 21:1-24:18 The first three chapters of this Torah portion deliver a legal code of laws and commandments that form a nucleus for the Torah's laws. The last chapter tells the story of how the people of Israel consented to keep these laws and entered into a covenant relationship with God through a series of rituals conducted by Moses.

Teruma—Exodus 25:1-27:19 In the Torah, Teruma refers to a certain type of offering dedicated to the Temple, like a tithe or first fruits offering. In Exodus 25, the contribution is for the building of a holy place. This Torah reading is occupied with the instructions for the building of the Tabernacle and its furnishings.

"SHEMA TOUR" PARTICIPANTS CHOOSE OUR 2020 COMMUNITY SERVICE PROJECT

First Planning Meeting on Sunday, February 9th at 12 Noon at TBH







On January 20th – Martin Luther King Jr. Day, Temple Beth Hillel members and Rabbi Glickman **continued our Shema Tour tradition** – a journey of listening and looking, to learn more about Greater Hartford organizations in need and determine how we, as a congregation, can help.

Nearly 35 adults and children were on this year's bus tour. Our first stop was the **Walk in the Light Church of God** on Garden Street in Hartford's North End, where we participated in a poignant program that honored Dr. King and his mission to unite all people. We were warmly welcomed by the church's Archbishop Dexter and his fellow clergy and congregants, several of whom were part of the Civil Rights movement in the 1950s and 1960s. Especially moving was a 12-year-old church member who memorized Dr. King's "*I Have a Dream*" speech and recounted it, word-for-word. We discovered how this small church is financially and physically pressed to serve an economically challenged community and could use assistance in many ways.

We next visited **Hebrew Health** (formerly known as the Hebrew Home & Hospital) in West Hartford and its Rabbi, Alan Lefkowitz. Rabbi Alan, the leader of the former Congregation Beth Ahm, now is a member of Temple Beth Hillel and teaches in our religious school. We learned about the organization's aging population and its many important services. We chatted with several of its residents and enjoyed a delicious lunch.

Our final stop was **The Simon Foundation Animal Rescue & Adoption Center** in Bloomfield, an impressive no -kill animal shelter. We toured the facility and learned how the staff finds "forever homes" for cats and dogs, rescues animals in severe distress, and offers a variety of boarding and training services to Greater Hartford residents and their pets.

A few days later, Shema Tour participants and other TBH members met to review what we saw and heard and decide which organization would be our Temple's year-long community service project.

After thoughtful discussion, the group voted for Walk in the Light Church of God as our 2020 outreach effort. Our focus will be to support the church and its members by organizing collections of many types of items that include food, clothing, furniture, and other essential items.


