## FROM THE RABBI'S STUDY



Putting together worship for community High Holy Days can be thought of as baking a loaf of bread to provide spiritual sustenance for a diverse group. Because we have so many restrictions on gathering, it is as though we are forced to bake a bread without wheat and without yeast -- normally the two most important ingredients! As you know, it can be done well, but it takes extra work, coordination of all the parts, creativity and open minds.

We will be using diverse ingredients:

- Live services held outdoors with several people in attendance
- Live services held in our sanctuary with 8 anonymous people attending to make a minyan
- Zoom and streaming formats
- Sections recorded specifically for this year
- Recordings of last year's High Holy Day services
- Interaction with clergy and congregants from area Reform synagogues

You might think that prior recordings are like stale bread. View it in a new light. Last year we were able to be ourselves -- congregants who were congregating! It is fine to look upon it with nostalgia. Remember, each service uses ancient elements (the prayers) which are repeated every year. Think of it, instead, as making fresh French toast from old bread. It is not only creative and tasty, but it provides just as much nourishment.

People crave several aspects:

- Being in the building they helped build and had moving experiences in
- Hearing the music
- Being a part of something great
- Being lifted up by inspiring words
- Seeing the people they care about.

We have tried to address all these needs.

Zoom and streaming formats have several limitations. One is attention span is dramatically shortened. They have some advantages. Recordings can be broadcast. Guest speakers can come on. Services can be viewed at any convenient time.

This year leaders of our TBH Family have come together to plan for the High Holidays, and I hope you all find a way to join your TBH family as well as we celebrate together.

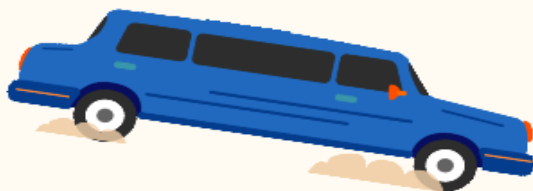

**In the next few days, ALL TBH MEMBERS will receive a High Holy Days SCHEDULE with Zoom links and Advance Registration links – both in print via the U.S. mail AND emails.** (If you do not receive emails, please call Laura Soll at 860-688-4499).

Our full schedule of services and events are the result of the hard work of our Rabbi, Cantor, the synagogue's Religious Practices Committee and our ongoing Safety Task Force, in an effort to be inclusive, creative, meaningful and safe.

You will find Temple Beth Hillel's offerings to have much more in common with previous years than you might think. Some will be held outdoors and with limited capacity for TBH members only. Others will be viewable online only, four will be prerecorded and can be viewed at anytime. The Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur morning services will be shorter to accommodate our on-line format. And our clergy will host at least two online services with other area rabbis and cantors.

**Only current Temple Beth Hillel members** will be able to watch the services and engage via Zoom; and **Only current members** will have the opportunity to attend several outdoor services with limited capacity. Advance sign-up information and Zoom links will be sent to all members.

Dear Temple Beth Hillel Family,

During these unprecedented times of global crisis, we, at TBH, have a hero!

**Our congregation is blessed to have an anonymous generous benefactor** who truly believes in and acts upon the words from the Talmud that state: "All Jews are responsible for each other."

**We have been offered a 2-to-1 matching grant, up to \$50,000.** That means if we raise \$50,000 in donations to our General Fund, the donor will add an additional \$100,000. Our General Fund is used to pay essential expenses including: our building's mortgage, utilities, and insurance; clergy and staff salaries; security services (greatly increased over the past year); snow removal and landscaping; and membership in the URJ. Achieving this fundraising goal will allow TBH to **significantly reduce or eliminate our budget deficit.**

Since this is a match, we are required to do our own fundraising. **Here are the rules:**

1. **Donations must be made to the General Fund.** Donations to other funds will NOT count towards the match.
2. **Any amount** donated counts towards the \$50,000 base figure and will be matched. Donations **must be made between now and December 31st, 2020.**
3. **Credit cards: Donate securely via PayPal by [clicking here](#), or by scanning the QR code below** with your smartphone camera, **or by calling Lori**, our administrative assistant, at the Temple office at **860-282-8466.**
4. **Checks: Mail to the Temple** or drop in the LOCKED mailbox outside the Temple office or at the end of our driveway.
5. **Cash: Donations can be dropped off** at the Temple office or dropped in the LOCKED mailboxes outside the Temple office or at the end of our driveway.

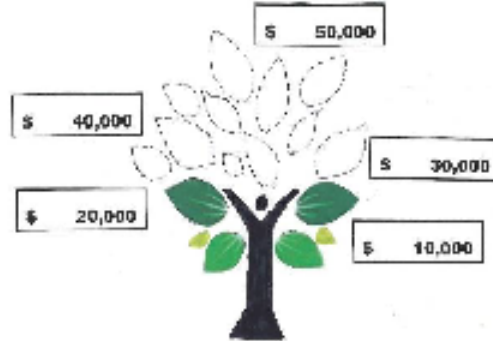

## TORAH PORTIONS

**KI TAVO—Deuteronomy 26:1-29:8** This Torah portion begins with laws regarding first fruits and tithes. It goes on to discuss covenant renewal, after which Moses recites the blessings guaranteed to Israel for covenant obedience and warns of the curses for apostasy.

**NITZAVIM/VAYELECH — Deuteronomy 29:9–30:20** In this portion, Moses invites the entire assembly of Israel to take on the covenant. He warns them that if they sin, they will go into exile, but he also predicts that, in the future, they will repent and God will return them to the land of Israel. In some years, Nitzavim is read together with the subsequent Torah portion, Vayelech, on the same Sabbath.

**VAYELECH**—In this short portion, Moses commands an assembly for a public Torah reading and covenant renewal once every seven years. He then finishes writing the scroll of the Torah and has it deposited in the Holy of Holies next to the ark of the covenant.

**ROSH HASHANAH —Genesis 21** Rosh Hashanah (Hebrew: ראש השנה, literally "head of the year"), is the Jewish New Year. It is the first of the High Holidays or Yamim Noraim ("Days of Awe"), celebrated ten days before Yom Kippur. Rosh Hashanah is observed on the first two days of Tishrei, the seventh month of the Hebrew calendar. It is described in the Torah as יום תרועה (Yom Teru'ah, a day of sounding [the Shofar]).

**HA'AZINU — Deuteronomy 32:1-32:52** This Torah portion is only a single chapter long, and the majority of it consists of the Song of Moses. The Song of Moses is a prophetic oracle warning Israel about apostasy to come and the resulting wrath of God. The song looks far into the future, even envisioning the Messianic advent amid rich and frightening apocalyptic imagery. After the conclusion of the song, Moses is told to ascend Mount Nebo and overlook the Promised Land before dying.

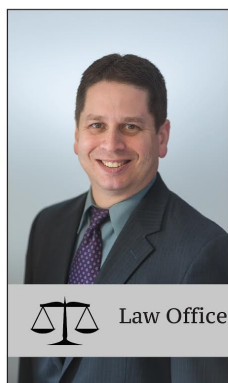
