Hello Temple Beth Hillel Families,



Dear Temple Beth Hillel Family,

During these unprecedented times of global crisis, we, at TBH, have a hero!

**Our congregation is blessed to have an anonymous generous benefactor** who truly believes in and acts upon the words from the Talmud that state: "All Jews are responsible for each other."

We have been offered a 2-to-1 matching grant, up to \$50,000. That means if we raise \$50,000 in donations to our General Fund, the donor will add an additional \$100,000. Our General Fund is used to pay essential expenses including: our building's mortgage, utilities, and insurance; clergy and staff salaries; security services (greatly increased over the past year); snow removal and landscaping; and membership in the URJ. Achieving this fundraising goal will allow TBH to significantly reduce or eliminate our budget deficit.

Since this is a match, we are required to do our own fundraising. Here are the rules:

- 1. **Donations must be made to the General Fund**. Donations to other funds will NOT count towards the match.
- 2. Any amount donated counts towards the \$50,000 base figure and will be matched. Donations must be made between now and December 31st, 2020.
- 3. Credit cards: Donate securely via PayPal by <u>clicking here</u>, or by scanning the QR code below with your smartphone camera, or by calling Lori, our administrative assistant, at the Temple office at **860-282-8466**.
- 4. Checks: Mail to the Temple or drop in the LOCKED mailbox outside the Temple office or at the end of our driveway.
- 5. Cash: Donations can be dropped off at the Temple office or dropped in the LOCKED mailboxes out side the Temple office or at the end of our driveway.



# TORAH PORTIONS

**KI TAVO—Deuteronomy 26:1-29:8** This Torah portion begins with laws regarding first fruits and tithes. It goes on to discuss covenant renewal, after which Moses recites the blessings guaranteed to Israel for covenant obedience and warns of the curses for apostasy.

**NITZAVIM/VAYELECH** — **Deuteronomy 29:9–30:20** In this portion, Moses invites the entire assembly of Israel to take on the covenant. He warns them that if they sin, they will go into exile, but he also predicts that, in the future, they will repent and God will return them to the land of Israel. In some years, Nitzavim is read together with the subsequent Torah portion, Vayelech, on the same Sabbath.

**VAYELECH**—In this short portion, Moses commands an assembly for a public Torah reading and covenant renewal once every seven years. He then finishes writing the scroll of the Torah and has it deposited in the Holy of Holies next to the ark of the covenant.

ROSH HASHANAH —Genesis 21 Rosh Hashanah (Hebrew: ראש השנה)(literally "head of the year"), is the Jewish New Year. It is the first of the High Holidays or Yamim Noraim ("Days of Awe"), celebrated ten days before Yom Kippur. Rosh Hashanah is observed on the first two days of Tishrei, the seventh month of the Hebrew calendar. It is described in the Torah as יום תרועה (Yom Teru'ah, a day of sounding [the Shofar]).

**HA'AZINU** — **Deuteronomy 32:1-32:52** This Torah portion is only a single chapter long, and the majority of it consists of the Song of Moses. The Song of Moses is a prophetic oracle warning Israel about apostasy to come and the resulting wrath of God. The song looks far into the future, even envisioning the Messianic advent amid rich and frightening apocalyptic imagery. After the conclusion of the song, Moses is told to ascend Mount Nebo and overlook the Promised Land before dying.
