Coronavirus Task Force Update

Indoor Friday and Saturday Services to Resume Starting April 30th

This past month, we were blessed to be able to resume indoor services at Temple to celebrate Shabbat mornings, and now we are grateful to be able to recommend holding all services on site again. We have all become thoroughly acquainted with the importance of social distancing, handwashing and mask-wearing over the past year. These safety measures will continue for some time. However, based on our local situation with the pandemic, the TBH Coronavirus Task Force can now recommend a careful resumption of in-person indoor worship.

The same safety measures will still be in place: pre-registration, health self-screening, social distancing, hand washing and mask wearing. Please bring your own prayer books, talit, and kipot. We will not ask you if you have had the vaccine since we will employ the same safety measures regardless of vaccine status.

Beginning Friday, April 30th and continuing every Friday and Saturday, Shabbat services will resume on site with an increased number of families. We still ask that you register in Eventbrite, and you may also call the office and speak with Lori to add yourself and your household to the list of attendees. We continue to track this information for contact tracing purposes.

In-person services cannot include an Oneg or food at this time, but this will allow us to continue to come together, to worship and read Torah, and to reconnect with our community. Social distancing must be maintained, but we can, once again, return to our TBH home.

We will continue to provide Zoom and Livestream services from here on out, so you can always choose the option to view and be part of the experience from your home. The Task Force will continue to review the size of onsite services as well as other events that occur at Temple. We'll also stay informed of pending changes to the State's guidance on health and safety. As things evolve, we will keep our congregation informed. We still live in a "new normal" but we're very excited about being able to do more together.



JEWISH COMMUNITY RELATIONS COUNCIL LAUNCHES "COMMUNITY CONVERSATIONS" WITH COMMUNITY READING OF *"THE WARMTH OF THE OTHER SUNS"*





This May, the Jewish Community Relations Council (JCRC) of the Jewish Federation of Greater Hartford and the Jewish Leadership Academy will launch Community Conversations, a series of community-wide programs that explore racism. The first Community Conversations' main component will be the communal book read of *'The Warmth of Other Suns: The Epic Story of America's Great Migration*" by Isabel Wilkerson. Temple Beth Hillel's Social Action Committee is involved in the planning.

This new project officially launches in May with an **optional virtual information session on Wednesday evening, May 19th** that will explain how the program works. Over the summer, there will be several thought-provoking programs for anyone interested, culminating in a final program in August. **Individuals, book clubs, and reading groups of friends** are invited to participate. While the program and resources are specifically designed for a Jewish audience, anyone, regardless of faith, can participate.

The objective of this program is to shine a light on the deep-seated and structural racism, specifically against black people, still being perpetrated in communities across Connecticut and the nation. Stories of escape, survival, determination, and assimilation, like those in Ms. Wilkerson's book, are part of our own history as Jews. By reading a book about the Great Migration, we can listen with empathy, react from a place of knowledge, and mourn together for lost branches of our joint family trees.

"The Warmth of Other Suns: The Epic Story of America's Great Migration" is available in paperback and/or hardcover at most bookstores or on line (Barnes & Noble, Amazon, Audible, etc.).

Those reading in a group might want to meet once everyone is finished with the entire book. Other groups may want to meet after each book club member has finished each part of the book (five parts total). If you want to **start your own book group for this project, contact Alana Butler at** <u>abutler@jewishhartford.org</u> and she can provide you with a book club kit. Alternatively, you can request to join an existing book group.

TORAH PORTIONS

EMOR— Leviticus 21:1-24:23 *Emor* begins with special laws of sanctity, propriety and purity for the priesthood. Leviticus 23 provides an overview of the biblical calendar, a listing of the LORD's appointed times.

BEHAR/BECHUKOTAI—Leviticus 25:1-27:34 This portion from the Torah introduces the laws of the sabbatical years, the jubilee and laws concerning redemption. In most years, synagogues read *Behar* together with the following portion, *Bechukotai*.

BECHUKOTAI-This last reading from Leviticus promises blessings and rewards for Israel if they will keep the Torah, but punishment and curses if they break the commandments of the Torah. The last chapter discusses laws pertaining to vows, valuations and tithes. In most years, synagogues read *Bechukotai* together with the preceding portion, *Behar*.

BAMIDBAR—Numbers 1:1-4:20 The first reading from *Bamidbar* and the thirty-fourth reading from the Torah begin with a census of the tribes of Israel and the Levitical families just prior to the departure from Sinai.

NASSO—Numbers 4:21-7:89. This Torah portion finishes up the census of the Levites that was under way at the end of the last Torah portion, before going on to discuss the purification of the camp, the ritual for a woman suspected of adultery, the laws of the Nazirite vow, the priestly benediction and the gifts the heads of the twelve tribes brought for the dedication of the altar.

BEHA'ALOTCHA—Numbers 8:1-12:15—This portion is jam-packed, telling the story of the consecration of the Levites, the first Passover in the wilderness, the silver trumpets, the cloud of glory, the departure from Sinai, the grumbling in the wilderness, the first Sanhedrin and the punishment of Miriam.
