FROM THE RABBI'S STUDY

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This story was related to us by Joel Marcovitch, inviting us to join him in Warsaw for Passover. It bears repeating to all your friends.

The Israeli Tent

At the Ukraine/Poland border, there are a number of tents. Many have an Israeli flag. These are run by many organizations, including: Jewish Agency for Israel (JAFI), Chabad and Joint Distribution Committee (JDC).

If Ukrainian refugees say they are Jewish and want to go to Israel, they are sent to the JDC tent. If you are Jewish, have a Jewish grandparent, or are married to a Jew or even have a sibling who is married to a Jew, you are welcomed in Israel under the Law Of Return. This was established at Israel's founding. Anyone who the Nazis would have sent to a concentration camp because of their Jewish connection is welcomed in Israel.

This story involves a woman, her mother and her 96 year old grandmother.

The woman is being processed at the JDC tent and they ask her if she is Jewish. She says that she isn't. Neither is her mother nor grandmoher, none are married to a Jew nor have a sibling married to a Jew.

"So, why did you come to this tent?"

"My grandmother told us to."

They turn to the older woman and she reaches into her bag for an envelope. No one else in the family knew about this envelope. It is from Yad Vashem, the Holocaust memorial in Jerusalem. Inside is a note recognizing her and her deceased husband as Righteous Gentiles who saved Jews during the Holocaust.

The whole family is now in Israel.

Our Religious School students kicked off May with something a little lighter – their annual Maccabia Games, organized by the Youth Committee.

Also happening this week is the annual URJ Summit. I'll be meeting and learning from leaders of the Reform movement across North America. I'm sure to be energized with new ideas and approaches to help our congregation move from strength to strength.

Coming up at Shabbat services on Friday, May 6th, we'll be hosting guest speaker [Rabbi Nikki DeBlosi, PhD](#). Her website states, "Named one of America's Most Inspiring Rabbis by the Jewish daily Forward, Rabbi Nikki combines a high-level academic background with an approachable, pastoral presence." Please join us for an enlightening and memorable discussion on gender inclusion!

We have many more events to look forward to this month, from the return of "Shabbat Under the Stars" on 5/13, the next "Tot Shabbat" on 5/14, to the Lag B'Omer campfire on 5/18, and the Men's Club "Spring Fling" on 5/21 (RSVP by May 6th!). CORONAVIRUS TASKFORCE UPDATE

Hello from the Coronavirus Task Force (CTF),

Last month we communicated a change to make masks optional for everyone indoors, and we're happy to report that we plan to continue this practice for the time being. Our guidelines for quarantine remain in effect, and we also strongly encourage anyone who does not feel well or is experiencing flu/cold symptoms to remain away from Temple. Additionally, **if you are unvaccinated it is very strongly recommended to wear a N95 or KN95 mask for your own protection.**

We're also very excited to offer **updated guidelines for having food in Temple:**

- The Coronavirus Task Force has thoroughly reviewed the current pandemic situation and we remain comfortable with consuming food and drink indoors. Additionally, use of the kitchen is now possible.
- Sisterhood has traditionally guided people who want to use the kitchen, so please be on the lookout for future communications on this topic. It will need a thorough cleaning, and I'm sure the Sisterhood would appreciate volunteers!
- CTF recommends that when food is to be served (indoors and outdoors), designated people serve the rest of the congregation. They should wear gloves and, where feasible, prepare individual plates/ servings.
- The purpose for this guidance is avoiding cross-contamination from one person to another, so let's avoid buffet-style food offerings for now.
- Members are welcome to bring food for Oneg or for other gatherings, services, etc. Please ensure that if you bring food, consider the above guidance and plan accordingly. For example, if you would like to bring a dessert tray for Oneg, you might pre-wrap the treats in plastic or aluminum foil.




Hello Friends and Family,

South Windsor's Co-Sponsorship of an Afghan Family

On April 6th, South Windsor welcomed a young family with a baby from Kabul, Afghanistan. Rabbi and Mindy drove them from New Haven up to their totally furnished South Windsor apartment where a traditional meal was waiting. Thank you to the TBH members who provided furniture household items, clothing and funds to help them begin their new lives in America.

The **South Windsor Refugee Alliance (SWRA)**, a community effort that includes a number of Temple members, area clergy, and other local residents, is working with IRIS-CT on a wide variety of elements related to housing, employment, education, healthcare, and much more.

SWRA's Core committee, on which Rabbi, Mindy and Laura Soll-Broxterman serve, has been working with several teams to fulfill a required array of medical, financial, cultural, and other appointments/visits. Among the TBH members playing key roles are Dr. Bob Rodner, Judy Scott, Dr. Gary Cohen, and Elizabeth Higgins.

Our commitment to the family will last for several months, and we seek:

TBH volunteers who can drive the family to medical appointments and English lessons in the first months after they arrive. **Contact** [Laura Soll-Broxterman](#).

TORAH PORTIONS

KEDOSHIM **Leviticus 19:1-20:27**—Leviticus 19 describes the holy community through a series of specific commandments. Leviticus 20 warns against the snares of sexual immorality and idolatry, mandating a death penalty for certain sins. Except in biblical leap years, *Kedoshim* is read on the same Sabbath as the previous reading, Acharei Mot.

EMOR **Leviticus 21:1-24:23**— *Emor* begins with special laws of sanctity, propriety and purity for the priesthood. Leviticus 23 provides an overview of the biblical calendar, a listing of the LORD's appointed times.

BEHAR **Leviticus 25:1-26:2**— This portion from the Torah introduces the laws of the sabbatical years, the jubilee and laws concerning redemption. In most years, synagogues read *Behar* together with the following portion, *Bechukotai*.

BECHUKOTAI **Leviticus 26:3-27:34**—This last reading from Leviticus promises blessings and rewards for Israel if they will keep the Torah, but punishment and curses if they break the commandments of the Torah. The last chapter discusses laws pertaining to vows, valuations and tithes. In most years, synagogues read *Bechukotai* together with the preceding portion, *Behar*.

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
