CORONAVIRUS TASK FORCE UPDATE

Hello TBH Family,

As Covid-19 transitions from pandemic to endemic, the Coronavirus Task Force continues to monitor rates of infection, hospitalizations, and deaths as well as the ongoing updates to guidance coming from the CDC and other health agencies. We will always keep the congregation informed and up to date with news on Covid-19 and other important health and safety issues.

Going forward, our message in the newsletter will change and shorten to reflect the fact that the situation and our guidance has remained static for several months in a row. You will continue to see any new recommendations or health protocols and our quarantine guidance, but the message will be short and sweet. Current guidance:

- Masks remain optional, but highly recommended for folks with underlying health concerns. Use a KN95 or N95.
- Please use hand sanitizer and practice proper hygiene when in Temple.
- Please stay home if you have any symptoms associated with covid or the flu.
- If a member of your household tests positive for covid or the flu, the entire family must quarantine from Temple for 5 days after symptoms have stopped.

HOSPITALITY FUND







WELCOME NEW TBH MEMBER Kalypso Szabat: *Why I wanted to become Jewish...*

When someone asks why I wanted to be part of the Jewish community, the answer isn't something that comes easily to mind. Not because there's not a specific reason, but because there is an abundance. Let's start with the word community. Having a strong community around you, to support you and watch you grow as a person as well as offer their help is something I've always wanted, and something that the Jewish people are known for. It takes a village right? When I first started learning about Judaism, it's the strength and togetherness of the people that attracted me. The strong sense of culture and being, despite being scattered across the globe. When I started diving nose deep into learning, the more I read the more in tune I felt with who I was supposed to be. The more I felt called to it.

TORAH PORTIONS

SHOFTIM—Deuteronomy 16:18-21:9 —The commandment for the king to write a copy of the Torah demonstrates the work of Messiah. He Himself is the Word made flesh. He is the copy of the Torah in human form. Furthermore, He writes a copy of the Torah as He writes the Torah upon our hearts. The Torah of King Messiah is written not with ink, but with the Spirit of the living God, not on tablets of stone, but on tablets of human hearts (2 Corinthians 3:3).

KI TETZE—Deuteronomy 21:10-25:19—Rabbi Meir said, There is a parable about this matter. To what can it be compared? It can be compared to two identical twin brothers. Both lived in a certain city. One was appointed king, and the other became a bandit. At the king's command they hanged the bandit. But everyone who saw him hanging there said, The king has been hung! Therefore the king issued a command and he was taken down. (b.Sanhedrin 46b)

KI TAVO—Deuteronomy 26:1-29:8—This Torah portion begins with laws regarding first fruits and tithes. It goes on to discuss covenant renewal, after which Moses recites the blessings guaranteed to Israel for covenant obedience and warns of the curses for apostasy.

NITZAVIM— Deuteronomy 29:9-30:20—In this portion, Moses invites the entire assembly of Israel to take on the covenant. He warns them that if they sin, they will go into exile, but he also predicts that, in the future, they will repent and God will return them to the land of Israel. In some years, Nitzavim is read together with the subsequent Torah portion, Vayelech, on the same Sabbath

VAYELECH— Deuteronomy 31:1-31:30— In this short portion, Moses commands an assembly for a public Torah reading and covenant renewal once every seven years. He then finishes writing the scroll of the Torah and has it deposited in the Holy of Holies next to the ark of the covenant.

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
