FROM THE RABBI'S STUDY



"Holy Words Written In The Concrete Foundation Under The Sanctuary Ark"

Over the past 28 years, many things happened to make Temple Beth Hillel what it is today.

Some have called this institutional knowledge. I prefer to call it sacred teachings.

They vary from the mundane, like, "How do you change the light bulbs behind the stained glass?" to the deep, like, "Why are our ark doors designed the way they are?"

I've spent several hours writing down 12 pages explaining how we acquired an ancient Torah from Morocco written on deer skin, the games Teshuva and Rabbi's Relay, where in the cemetery the foreskins from circumcisions are buried and other arcane histories.

It would be a pleasure to spend a few minutes after services wandering through Temple explaining these.

PS. There really are holy words written in the concrete foundation of Temple. I came by the night that it was poured. Under the ark is the four-letter name of God. Shema and V'ahavta are written under the podiums. *Da lifne mi ata omed* is written on the bima. *Mah tovu* is written under the front doorway.

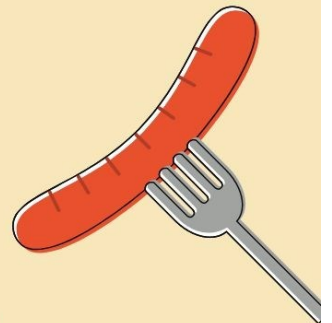

To be a Reform Jew means to see religion as articulated by Isaiah 58:

To break every cruel chain, feed the hungry and bring the poor into your house.

For decades, the **Religious Action Center for Reform Judaism** has put those words into action. Civil rights legislation of the 60's was written in their building in Washington, D.C. Currently, combating anti-Semitism, environmental justice and promoting rights are at the forefront of their work.

Every other year, they hold a gathering in Washington, DC, for us to come and listen to the people affecting change in our country. The **D.C. Day of Action** is amazing on many levels: even more than hearing the speakers is meeting our counterparts from synagogues all over the country; and even more than that is forming a bond with everyone from Temple Beth Hillel to bring holiness to our community.

You can join us May 10th and 11th.

Right now, a group of us have already arranged for transportation and booked rooms at the host hotel. The Rabbi's Discretionary Fund is set up to provide any assistance* needed.

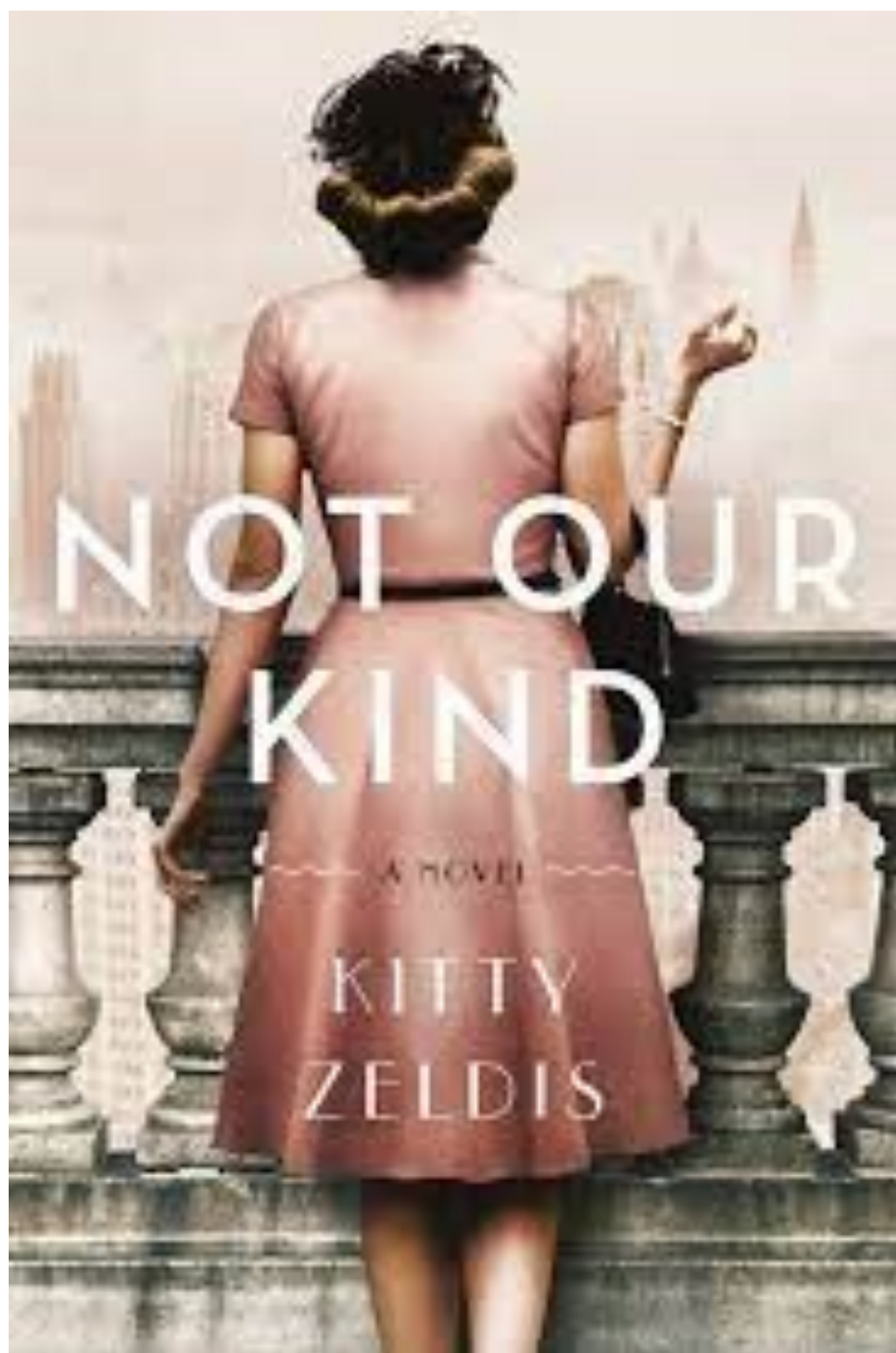

TORAH PORTIONS

[EMOR](#) Leviticus 21:1-24:23 Emor begins with special laws of sanctity, propriety and purity for the priesthood. Leviticus 23 provides an overview of the biblical calendar, a listing of the LORD's appointed times.

[BEHAR-BECHUKOTAI](#) Leviticus 25:1-27:34 This portion from the Torah introduces the laws of the sabbatical years, the jubilee and laws concerning redemption. In most years, synagogues read *Behar* together with the following portion, *Bechukotai*, which means "In My Statutes." The name comes from the first verse of the reading, which begins with the words "If you walk in My statutes ..." (Leviticus 26:3). This last reading from Leviticus promises blessings and rewards for Israel if they will keep the Torah, but punishment and curses if they break the commandments of the Torah

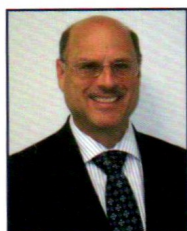
[BAMIDBAR](#) Numbers 1:1-4:20 The book of Numbers tells the story of Israel's trek through the wilderness on their way to the Promised Land, their failure at the edge of the land and the subsequent forty years of wandering. It concludes with the story of the second generation's triumphs over the first Canaanite resistance. The book ends with the Israelites poised on the edge of Canaan, ready to take their inheritance.

[SHENI SHEL SHAVU'OT](#) Deuteronomy 14:22-16:17 On the second day of Shavu'ot we read Deuteronomy 14:22-16:17 and Numbers 28:26-31 from the Torah. The haftarah portion is Habakkuk 2:20-3:19, with an additional Messianic reading from Acts 2:1-47.
