## Reminder From The Treasurer...

Our dues and donations to the General Fund are key contributors to our bottom line, but there are many other ways everyone can all help:

- 1. Recruit your friends and family to join TBH as members.
- 2. Voluntarily pay more than required towards your membership dues.
- 3. "Sponsor" a member on abatement by donating the difference in the abated dues and full dues.
- 4. Help find renters/tenants to use our extra space when not in use.
- 5. Make High Holy Days and other Donations.

If you did not make a High Holy Days donation last year or in prior years, please consider donating this and future years. If you have donated in the past, we thank you and ask that you please continue donating and possibly increasing your donation this year. Nothing is too small - everyone's donations add up!

6. Religious School Families' Donations to the General Fund

We are very fortunate to be able to offer Religious School families a <u>temporary</u> reduced fee of \$100 per child due to a very generous donation by the Glickman Foundation. This provides all Religious School families an opportunity to donate the difference between what the school would have cost and the current fee. This level of donation will help close our budget gap.

If you are not the parents of religious school children, please consider "sponsoring" a student whose family would like to make the additional contribution, but is not financially able to do so.

Please keep in mind that donating to the Religious School Fund does not help in closing our gap so we ask that you all donate to the General Fund. The table below shows what the fees would have been.

7. Retired Members Direct Distributions from Retirement Accounts / IRAs

All of our retired members can take advantage of reducing their taxable income from their Required Minimum Distributions by directly donating to the TBH General Fund. This not only helps our members avoid paying higher taxes, but will also serve to help close our budget gap. It is important you know that TBH always has and will continue to welcome everyone as members, regardless of their financial situation.

Everyone coming together will keep TBH on track for a long and successful future. Together, we can!



### **TORAH PORTIONS**

Parashat Ki Teitzei <u>Deuteronomy 21:10-25:19</u> Ki Teitzei ("When You Go Out") contains numerous laws, more than appear in any other Torah portion. These include laws about the treatment of a captive woman, returning lost objects, forbidden mixtures, the erection of a rooftop fence, rape, collateral, and workers' wages.

Parashat Ki Tavo <u>Deuteronomy 26:1-29:8</u> Ki Tavo ("When You Come") opens by describing the ceremony of the first fruit offering (bikkurim) and the declaration made upon the completion of tithing. It concludes with a detailed description of blessings that follow obedience to God's laws and curses that come with their desecration.

Parashat Nitzavim <u>Deuteronomy 29:9-30:20</u> In Nitzavim ("Standing"), Moses addresses the Israelites, emphasizing the importance of following God's covenant and of not worshiping other gods. He describes the process of repentance and returning to God, and stresses that God's commandments are achievable and "not in the heavens."

Parashat Vayeilech <u>Deuteronomy 31:1-31:30</u> Vayeilech ("He Went") opens as Moses tells the Israelites that he will not lead them into the Land of Israel, and that Joshua will take over. He instructs the Israelites to gather and read Torah publicly every seven years. At God's command, Moses writes a poem bearing witness to God's covenant with the Israelites.
