

TORAH PORTIONS

Parashat Ha'azinu <u>Deuteronomy 32:1-32:52</u> n Ha'azinu ("Listen"), Moses recites a poem praising God and criticizing the sins of the Israelites. He describes the misfortunes that the Israelites will face and the damage God will ultimately wreak on their oppressors. The portion ends as God commands Moses to ascend Mount Nebo, where he is to die.

Parashat Bereshit <u>Genesis 1:1-6:8</u> Bereishit ("In the Beginning"), the first parashah in the annual Torah reading cycle, begins with God's creation of the world. The first people, Adam and Eve, eat from the Tree of Knowledge and are banished from the Garden of Eden. Their elder son, Cain, kills their younger son, Abel, and Cain is destined to a life of wandering.

Parashat Noach <u>Genesis 6:9-11:32</u> Noach ("Noah") begins as God decides to destroy mankind with a flood. At God's command, the righteous Noah builds an ark, where Noah, his family, and select animals survive the flood. Noah's children bear children, and several generations develop. God confounds the speech of people building the Tower of Babel.
